


## Disrupted Learning

A Visual Look at Behavioral Trends in North Dakota

Analysis of special education data points to a clear and concerning trend: behavioral needs among students with disabilities (SWD) in North Dakota are on the rise.



The total number of students with behavior-related disabilities has increased over time. The number of students identified with Emotional Disturbance (ED) has declined, but this is offset by an increase in students identified with Other Health Impairment (OHI), which often includes behavior-related conditions.



All SWD


- ED

## NORTH DAKOTA VS THE NATIONAL AVERAGE The percent of students with a primary disability

The percent of students with a primary disability of ED in ND is higher than the national rate (based on 2023-24 data).





Chronic absenteeism rates have increased since 2020-21. Over 44% of students with ED are chronically absent.
