



EXECUTIVE ORDER 2020-43.4

WHEREAS, a state of emergency was declared by Governor Doug Burgum on March 13, 2020, in response to the global COVID-19 pandemic; Executive Order 2020-03 activated the State Emergency Operations Plan (SEOP), implementing appropriate response and recovery actions and future mitigation measures; and,

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a transmissible, potentially fatal respiratory illness that spreads in the air through droplets from infected persons, including individuals who have no symptoms and do not know they are infected; and,

WHEREAS, epidemics and outbreaks of dangerous diseases have been experienced through the history of North Dakota; our courts have acknowledged the State's authority to issue orders for the protection of public health and to prevent the spread of contagious diseases; and,

WHEREAS, throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, use of face coverings and physical distancing have been promoted consistently as public health measures to slow and mitigate the spread of COVID-19 throughout the state; and,

WHEREAS, State Health Officer Order 2020-08.1 requires face coverings be worn in all indoor public spaces, and all outdoor spaces where physical distancing of six feet or more is not possible; this Order is incorporated herein by reference.

NOW THEREFORE, Doug Burgum, Governor of North Dakota, by virtue of the authority under Article V, Section 1 of the North Dakota Constitution and North Dakota Century Code 37-17.1, in consultation with the State Health Officer and the co-leaders of Unified Command, hereby orders:

- 1. Banquets, Ballrooms, Weddings and Event Venues:
 - a. Effective 8:00 a.m. Friday, January 8, 2021, occupancy of banquet, ballroom and event venues is limited to 50% of occupancy not to exceed the capacity limits identified within the ND Smart Restart Large Gathering Tiered Capacity document.
 - b. Event organizers are encouraged to provide a health plan to their local elected leaders and local public health units for review.
 - c. Food and beverage service must be provided to seated patrons; no "standup" service, or service to patrons in a waiting area is permitted;
 - d. Dance areas must be closed;
 - e. Seating arrangements and tables must allow at least six feet of physical distance between individual parties;

- f. As required under State Health Officer Order 2020-08.1, face coverings must be worn by all owners, managers and employees at all times; face coverings must be worn by all patrons except when consuming food or beverages;
- g. Post signs in conspicuous public areas of the establishment that:
 - i. Display face covering and physical distancing requirements;
 - ii. Include symptoms of COVID-19;
 - iii. Instruct anyone experiencing symptoms to stay at home.
- h. Religious events, governmental meetings and academic instructional delivery settings are exempt from this order. Religious organizations are strongly encouraged to utilize COVID-19 mitigation strategies from the ND Department of Health and the Centers for Disease Control.
- i. Banquets, ballrooms and other event venues operated under Tribal Code or Tribal ordinance are exempt from this order, but are strongly encouraged to utilize the COVID-19 mitigation strategies from the ND Department of Health and the Centers for Disease Control.
- j. More restrictive measures may be adopted by local government entities.
- k. The requirements defined in Section (1)(a)-(h), above, will remain in effect until 8:00 a.m., Friday, January 29, 2021.
- 2. Bars, Restaurants and Food Service Establishments.
 - a. Effective 8:00 a.m. Friday, January 8, 2021, occupancy of bars, restaurants and food service establishments is limited to 65% of the licensed seating capacity, not to exceed a maximum of 200 patrons;
 - b. Food and beverage service must be provided to seated patrons; no "standup" service or service to patrons in a waiting area is permitted;
 - c. Dance areas must be closed;
 - d. Seating arrangements and tables must allow at least six feet of physical distance between individual parties;
 - e. As required under State Health Officer Order 2020-08.1, face coverings must be worn by owners, managers and employees at all times; face coverings must be worn by all patrons except when consuming food or beverages;
 - f. In-person dining and service may resume under normal business hours, consistent with state and local regulations;
 - g. Post signs in conspicuous public areas of the establishment that:
 - i. Display face covering and physical distancing requirements;
 - ii. Include symptoms of COVID-19;
 - iii. Instruct anyone experiencing symptoms to stay at home.
 - h. Bars, restaurants and food service establishments operated under Tribal Code or Tribal ordinance are exempt from this order, but are strongly encouraged to utilize the COVID-19 mitigation strategies from the ND Department of Health and the Centers for Disease Control. More restrictive measures may be adopted by local government entities.
 - i. The requirements defined under Section (2)(a)-(g), above, will remain in effect until 8:00 a.m., Friday, January 29, 2021.

This order is issued on the following bases and for the following reasons:

- 1. The Governor is vested with the executive authority pursuant to Article V, Section 1, of the North Dakota Constitution.
- 2. The Governor is vested with statutory authority to issue executive orders, to minimize or avert the effects of a disaster or emergency pursuant to Chapter 37-17.1 of the North Dakota Century Code.
- 3. Executive Orders have the force and effect of law under NDCC § 37-17.1-05 (2).
- 4. A coordinated and effective effort of appropriate government departments is required to minimize the impact of emergencies and disasters in this state.
- 5. All local, county and state law enforcement officers are authorized and directed to enforce the provisions of this Executive Order.

This Order will take effect at 8:00 a.m. Friday, January 8, 2021.
