

PROCLAMATION COMPLEX REGIONAL PAIN SYNDROME MONTH NOVEMBER 2017

WHEREAS, Complex Regional Pain Syndrome (CRPS), also known as Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy (RSD), is a nerve disorder that causes chronic pain; and

WHEREAS, the symptoms of CRPS/RSD are often described as a "burning" sensation that is painfully out of proportion to the severity of the initial injury, and extreme sensitivity to the touch and swelling; and

WHEREAS, CRPS/RSD was first identified during the Civil War, but despite its long history it remains a poorly understood condition with no known cure; and

WHEREAS, the National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Stroke and other institutes of the National Institutes of Health support research relating to CRPS/RSD.

NOW, THEREFORE, as Governor of the State of North Dakota, I do hereby proclaim November 2017, **COMPLEX REGIONAL PAIN SYNDROME DAY** in the State of North Dakota.
