

PROCLAMATION NECROTIZING FASCIITIS AWARENESS MONTH MAY 2019

WHEREAS, Necrotizing Fasciitis was first described within medical literature in 1883 by Jean Alfred Fournier and was originally described as a disease of unknown cause; and

WHEREAS, Necrotizing Fasciitis is a serious yet uncommon bacterial skin infection that spreads quickly and kills the body's soft tissue; and Necrotizing Fasciitis attracts a high profile within the popular media where it is often referred to as the "flesh eating bug or virus"; and

WHEREAS, the most common causes of the disease are the bacteria group A hemolytic, Streptococcus pyogenes and Staphylococcus aureus, either alone or in combination; and other cases are reported to be caused by other types of bacteria including those naturally found within the intestines of normal healthy individuals; and

WHEREAS, Necrotizing Fasciitis can occur in any age group, although sometimes there are precipitating factors, and may cause death; and

WHEREAS, Necrotizing Fasciitis is most commonly associated with surgical procedures, but may be seen in those with diabetes mellitus, atherosclerotic vascular disease, malignancy and hypertension; and in rare occasions Necrotizing Fasciitis may occur following minor injuries to the skin, but the cause is not always apparent and may occur in seemingly healthy individuals.
