

## PROCLAMATION **SUDDEN UNEXPLAINED DEATH IN CHILDHOOD AWARENESS MONTH**MARCH 2019

WHEREAS, Sudden Unexplained Death in Childhood (SUDC) is the death of a child over the age of 12 months which remains unexplained after a thorough case investigation is conducted, including performance of a complete autopsy, examination of the death scene, and review of the child's medical history; and

WHEREAS, annually, there are approximately 400 cases of SUDC in the United States between the ages of 1 and 19 – including more than 240 younger children under the age of 5 – who die under these circumstances; and

WHEREAS, while less common than Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS), which occurs before the first birthday, SUDC is an important health concern deserving of increased public awareness and research; and

WHEREAS, we recognize the dedicated efforts of organizations such as the SUDC Foundation, medical professionals and volunteers that are working to better understand the causes of SUDC, improve the health of infants and children and provide much needed hope and support for those families grieving the heartbreaking sudden unexplained death of a child; and

WHEREAS, Sudden Unexplained Death in Childhood Awareness Month provides an opportunity to honor the memory of the young lives that ended too soon, show encouragement and support for the families and loved ones forever devastated by their loss, and increase public awareness of SUDC and the ongoing search for answers.

NOW, THEREFORE, as Governor of the State of North Dakota, I do hereby proclaim March 2019, SUDDEN UNEXPLAINED DEATH IN CHILDHOOD AWARENESS MONTH in the State of North Dakota.
